

Jesus as a Prophet

Matthew 21:11 – "The crowds answered, 'This is Jesus, the prophet from Nazareth in Galilee.'"

Luke 7:16 – "They were all filled with awe and praised God. 'A great prophet has appeared among us,' they said."

John 4:19 – "'Sir,' the woman said, 'I can see that you are a prophet.'"

Luke 24:19 – "'What things?' he asked. 'About Jesus of Nazareth,' they replied. 'He was a prophet, powerful in word and deed before God and all the people.'"

John 6:14 – "After the people saw the sign Jesus performed, they began to say, 'Surely this is the Prophet who is to come into the world.'"

John 12:49 – "For I did not speak on my own, but the Father who sent me commanded me to say all that I have spoken."

Acts 7:37 – "This is the Moses who told the Israelites, 'God will raise up for you a prophet like me from your own people.'"

Acts 3:22 – "For Moses said, 'The Lord your God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among your own people; you must listen to everything he tells you.'"

Jesus in Submission to God (A Higher Entity)

John 5:30 – "By myself I can do nothing; I judge only as I hear, and my judgment is just, for I seek not to please myself but him who sent me."

Matthew 26:39 – "Going a little farther, he fell with his face to the ground and prayed, 'My Father, if it is possible, may this cup be taken from me. Yet not as I will, but as you will.'"

John 14:28 – "If you loved me, you would be glad that I am going to the Father, for the Father is greater than I."

John 20:17 – "'Do not hold on to me, for I have not yet ascended to the Father. Go instead to my brothers and tell them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.'"

Luke 22:42 – "Father, if you are willing, take this cup from me; yet not my will, but yours be done."

John 17:3 – "Now this is eternal life: that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom you have sent."

Jesus Lacking Godly Attributes (Omniscience, Omnipotence, etc.)

Mark 13:32 – "But about that day or hour no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father."

John 11:34 – "Where have you laid him?" he asked. "Come and see, Lord," they replied."

Matthew 20:23 – "Jesus said to them, 'You will indeed drink from my cup, but to sit at my right or left is not for me to grant.'"

Mark 6:5 – "He could not do any miracles there, except lay his hands on a few sick people and heal them."

Jesus as Lower Than the Angels

Hebrews 2:9 – "But we do see Jesus, who was made lower than the angels for a little while, now crowned with glory and honour because he suffered death, so that by the grace of God he might taste death for everyone."

Psalms 8:5 (prophetic of Jesus) – "You have made them a little lower than the angels and crowned them with glory and honour."

Other Relevant Verses

John 7:16 – "Jesus answered, 'My teaching is not my own. It comes from the one who sent me.'"

1 Corinthians 11:3 – "But I want you to realize that the head of every man is Christ, and the head of the woman is man, and the head of Christ is God."

Acts 2:22 – "Fellow Israelites, listen to this: Jesus of Nazareth was a man accredited by God to you by miracles, wonders, and signs, which God did among you through him, as you yourselves know."

Matthew 27:46 – "About three in the afternoon Jesus cried out in a loud voice, 'Eli, Eli, lema sabachthani?' (which means 'My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?')."

Luke 2:52 – "And Jesus grew in wisdom and stature, and in favour with God and man."

Jesus Lacking Godly Attributes

Mark 11:13 – "Seeing in the distance a fig tree in leaf, he went to find out if it had any fruit. When he reached it, he found nothing but leaves, because it was not the season for figs."

Matthew 8:24-25 – "Suddenly a furious storm came up on the lake, so that the waves swept over the boat. But Jesus was sleeping. The disciples went and woke him, saying, 'Lord, save us! We're going to drown!'"

John 5:36 – "For the works that the Father has given me to finish—the very works that I am doing—testify that the Father has sent me."

John 14:31 – "But he comes so that the world may learn that I love the Father and do exactly what my Father has commanded me."

Matthew 24:36 – "But about that day or hour no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father."

Mark 10:18 – "'Why do you call me good?' Jesus answered. 'No one is good—except God alone.'"

Luke 18:19 – "'Why do you call me good?' Jesus answered. 'No one is good—except God alone.'"

Mark 3:21 – "When his family heard about this, they went to take charge of him, for they said, 'He is out of his mind.'"



Full Verses Omitted in Many Modern Translations

Matthew 17:21 NKJV: "However, this kind does not go out except by prayer and fasting."

Reason: Not found in early manuscripts.

Matthew 18:11 NKJV: "For the Son of Man has come to save that which was lost."

Reason: Lacking in the oldest manuscripts.

Matthew 23:14 NKJV: "Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you devour widows' houses, and for a pretense make long prayers. Therefore you will receive greater condemnation."

Reason: Missing in some early manuscripts; appears similar to Mark 12:40 and Luke 20:47.

Mark 7:16 NKJV: "If anyone has ears to hear, let him hear!"

Reason: Omitted in early manuscripts.

Mark 9:44 & 46 NKJV: "where 'Their worm does not die, And the fire is not quenched.'"

Reason: Repetition; absent in key manuscripts.

Mark 11:26 NKJV: "But if you do not forgive, neither will your Father in heaven forgive your trespasses."

Reason: Missing in early sources.

Mark 15:28 NKJV: "So the Scripture was fulfilled which says, 'And He was numbered with the transgressors.'"

Reason: Absent in the earliest manuscripts.

Luke 17:36 NKJV: "Two men will be in the field: the one will be taken and the other left."

Reason: Lacking in early manuscripts.

Luke 23:17 NKJV: "(For it was necessary for him to release one to them at the feast.)"

Reason: Missing in earlier textual sources.

John 5:4 NKJV: "For an angel went down at a certain time into the pool and stirred up the water; then whoever stepped in first, after the stirring of the water, was made well of whatever disease he had."

Reason: Not found in the oldest Greek manuscripts.

Acts 8:37 NKJV: "Then Philip said, 'If you believe with all your heart, you may.' And he answered and said, 'I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God.'"

Reason: Not present in early manuscripts.

Acts 15:34 NKJV: "However, it seemed good to Silas to remain there."

Reason: Absent in ancient sources.

Acts 24:7 NKJV: "But the commander Lysias came by and with great violence took him out of our hands."

Reason: Missing in earlier manuscripts.

Acts 28:29 NKJV: "And when he had said these words, the Jews departed and had a great dispute among themselves."

Reason: Absent in early Greek texts.

Romans 16:24 NKJV: "The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you all. Amen."

Reason: Missing in earlier manuscripts.

Passages with Partial Omissions

(Matthew 6:13) NKJV The Doxology in the Lord's Prayer: "For Yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen." (This verse is not included in new versions)

Reason: Omitted in some versions as it is absent from the earliest manuscripts.

(Mark 16:9–20) The Longer Ending of Mark: Included in the NKJV but often marked as questionable in notes. (Verses 9-20 not included in new versions)

Reason: Absent in the earliest and most reliable manuscripts.

(John 7:53–8:11) The Story of the Adulterous Woman: Included in the NKJV but marked as a later addition. (Entire story removed)

Reason: Absent from many of the earliest manuscripts.

1 John 5:7–8 ("Comma Johanneum") NKJV: "For there are three that bear witness in heaven: The Father, the Word, and the Holy Spirit; and these three are one." (Verse Changed)

Reason: Found only in late manuscripts; absent in the earliest Greek texts.
